The Arts Program at Eugene Lang College offers majors in these areas of study:

- Contemporary Dance (BA, Contemporary Dance)
- Contemporary Music (BA, Contemporary Music)
- Theater (BA, Theater)
- Visual Studies (BA. The Arts)

Each major requires a set of courses specified below. The Arts Program also offers minors in Contemporary Dance, Contemporary Music, Theater, and Visual Studies; see final four pages for minor requirements.

In addition to the requirements outlined in the program worksheets that follow, Lang has specific general requirements, including a minimum number of credits in liberal arts courses as well as college residency requirements. All students should read the general Degree Requirements and consult with an advisor each semester to ensure they are on track to graduate.
